Dear Hampshire Breeders,

First right off the bat I would like to thank Jeff Ebert for keeping the American Sheep Association improving every year. Little does anyone know that he has went through around 20 new employees the last year. It has been a trying time in trying to keep employees at any job and I know he is frustrated. He has remained positive in the next hire is going to work out. We sometimes forget to say thank you! I would like to remind everyone about becoming a lifetime member of the AHSA. This would allow you not to ever pay the yearly membership fee, again. I believe we all should try to be better at registering our animals also. 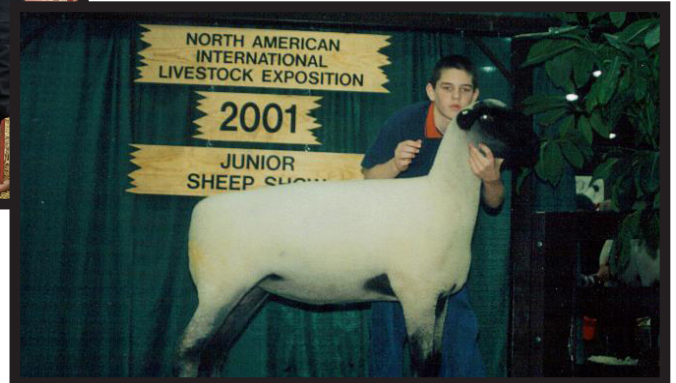

# Featuring Mike Storms & Family



## INTRODUCE YOURSELF & YOUR FAMILY

My name is Mike Storms and I have a problem... At least my wife, Lee, thinks so. She is an enabler. She does a fantastic job taking care of the house and dog chores so I can spend more time with the sheep. With the help of my son, Kerry, an MD in the Marshfield Clinic healthcare system working out of Eau Claire, Wisconsin and daughter, Suzanna, a DVM working on her Ph.D. at the University of Illinois Vet School, where she is a full-time faculty member, I may be able to work through this addiction. Due to Kerry's schedule and 3 children, he doesn't get much time to help with the sheep anymore. However, Suzanna helps a lot with herd health, and she does the AI for us and collects the rams for semen freezing.

## GIVE US A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF YOUR HAMPSHIRE FLOCK

We have a slick sheared/wether style flock of Hampshires. They are rather intensely linebred. We now have 52 working descendants of the 3-01 ewe. Most have her in their pedigree multiple times. She was the result of a bred ewe purchase from Dale Steffens and our first AI mating to Mr. Goodfellow. The 3-01 ewe won her class at Louisville as a fitted lamb and won the first Slick Sheared Yearling ewe class at Louisville the next year. She produced a class winning ram, and a first and second place slick sheared yearling ewes at the national show for us in the 2000 decade. We introduce new genetics by AI to that line of females and the results have been pretty good. In 2003 we got a ram from Brian Reilly that produced a lot of winning wethers for us and in 2008 we purchased a Wheaton ram that had a substantial influence on our flock. The last ram we purchased was a Miller ram back in 2011. We have raised all of our rams since then. Occasionally we buy a top-quality ewe from outside breeders as an outcross to breed to our rams to hopefully produce a stud ram for us. Most recently we bought a ewe from Brian Reilly that really nicked well with Truck Yeah, and another from Miller Hamps that we mated to Hollywood. Our ewes have to be able to survive on forage and live in the great outdoors. They are on fescue pasture about 9 months a year. We bring them home about a month before lambing and for 2 months until lambs are weaned.

## WHY DID YOU CHOOSE TO INCLUDE REGISTERED HAMPSHIRE IN YOUR SHEEP OPERATION?

We started out with Hamps in 1997. We previously had Suffolks starting in 1984 but the Spider Syndrome flushed us out of them. Kerry liked the Hampshire characteristics when he started 4H so we switched to Hamps then.

## WHAT ADVICE DO YOU HAVE FOR PEOPLE STARTING OUT IN THE SHEEP BUSINESS?

First of all, as Mike Kleinert told me when we were starting out, it's not about the sheep, it's about the kids. My goal with the sheep was to instill discipline and dedication to my kids, and a tool for them to learn that the more work you put into a project the more successful you will be. I'm pleased with the results. As far as the sheep go, I'd start out by going to an established breeder that has a true breeding program, not just a multiplier who's only interested in breeding to "trendy" rams that have cool names. Skeletal correctness and muscle never go out of style. Frame size comes and goes. Shag looks great but without rib, muscle and structural correctness, what good is it? The breeder should be able to tell you how many dwarfs, inverted eyelids, prolapses and bad udders the mother and father of your prospective purchase has produced. Remember if you breed an FD ewe to an FD ram 25% of your lamb crop will be dwarfs. Can you afford to throw away 25% of your lamb crop? FD bred to DD will produce 50% dwarfs. It's simple Mendelian Genetics. Use Common sense in your breeding program. The great rams only come along about once every 10 years. Just look at some of the better-known Hamp breeders like Miller, Slack, etc. When they find a great ram they use him for a decade. If the ram does not work, he'll be for sale as a yearling. Buy semen and stud ewes out of the great rams.

## WHAT ARE ONE OR TWO ITEMS THAT YOU HAVE FOUND TO BE CRITICAL FOR THE SUCCESS OF YOUR SHEEP OPERATION?

I have a twenty-year-old sheep management software program that includes a pedigree of every sheep with a picture of that sheep. I note on there any animal that has parrot mouth, inverted eyelids, prolapse, buck knees or other genetic defects. With the picture pedigree it's easy to follow and discover where those defects originated. Then we can quickly eliminate that problem, or at least isolate it and breed away from it. Another valuable tool is a set of scales. We weigh all lambs at 30, 60, 90, and 120 days. This year we are using a new DNA testing company that tests for 20 different genetic traits. All lambs are gene tested when we dock them. AI is another critically important tool.

## WHO ARE SOME PEOPLE THAT YOU CREDIT FOR YOUR SUCCESS WITH HAMPSHIRE?

First, family. Mom, dad, wife and kids. Then Jim Van Cleve and his sons Brad and David, Mike Kleinert, Richard Chrome, judging team coach Doug Parrett. The Beckmier Brothers gave us a lot of help when we started out. I have watched the programs of several breeders and studied what worked for them and tried to emulate that. Such as Wheaton, Miller, Ellerbrock, Brian Reilly and Slack. We've purchased sheep from all of them over the years. Most of all I would like to credit the people that buy and show our sheep. The Frimml girls in Iowa have done an excellent job, and no one can get them ready better than Finnegan-Porter Livestock. Alivia is a fantastic showman and an extremely dedicated worker.

# National Ram Sale

Historically, the National Ram Sale was an annual landmark event wherein the finest sheep in the nation were assembled in one major sale. Buyers from across the nation gathered in Salt Lake City for this event to select the future genetics for their flocks. Beginning in 1918 and continuing through the 1980's, the sale was a key social experience that we now refer to as networking. Being in the west, the major breeds in the sale included Suffolk, Rambouillet, Columbia, Targhee, and of course Hampshires. Hampshires have long been a highly desired component for terminal sires as the lambs are known for their fast growth, muscle qualities and stamina at birth and on throughout the growth cycle.

Sensing the need for a return to those values, a group of innovative and creative consignors renewed the National Ram Sale in 2021 with a powerhouse sale on October 9th at the Wasatch Events Center in Heber City, Utah. This sale brought buyers together from across the nation, with many attending in person and a host of others joining in online for the inaugural event. Prices reflected the elite quality of the 290 rams presented for sale with several rams bringing the top prices for the breed in 2021. Complimenting the rams, were 75 select commercial ewes, numerous speakers, social events and a superb BBQ Lamb dinner.

This year there are plans to expand the social, educational and food experiences while again assembling the top group of rams in the nation. Entries will open on April 1st for the sale, and we are seeking the top Hampshire breeders in the nation to join with us in Heber City on October 7th and 8th. Our goal is not to have the largest sale, but the highest quality sale so new consignor acceptance will be limited but we are seeking a few top-quality Hampshire consignments. We live in the exciting data era which includes EBV's and Genomic Enhanced EBV's which are key tools for evaluation and sire selection to maximize production in the commercial sector. The availability of data for buyers brings significant added value to the rams.

Please accept this as your personal invitation to join us in Heber City in October. Whether you are a buyer, consignor or just want a great vacation, the National Ram Sale 2022 will be the social, networking, educational and food event of the year!

## **2022 AHSA Futurity Rules**

### *Sponsored by the American Hampshire Sheep Association*

#### **Point Scoring:**

- A point records form must be filled out for each show and forwarded to the American Hampshire Sheep Association office by November 1, 2022. The form must be signed by the superintendent of the show who must also verify the youth owning the lamb did physically show the animal unless physically impaired. If physically impaired, the junior member must still be present at the show even if they are unable to show their sheep in the show ring.
- At each individual show the ewe may earn futurity points from both the open division show and/or the junior division show only if the shows are held at different times and judged by different judges. Only the junior show placing from the North American International Livestock Exposition will be counted. Futurity ewes can only be shown in breeding class. The ewe lamb and yearling ewe cannot be shown in market classes.
- Futurity yearling ewes and ewe lambs may be shown at an unlimited number of shows and submit points from the shows shown in. Only the top 5-point forms submitted can be used toward the futurity final point totals.
- No designated show will be held before May 1st.
- Futurity awards will be announced during the annual meeting of the American Hampshire Sheep Association. Premiums will be mailed to the winners from the AHSA office after December 1<sup>st</sup>. Winners will also be posted on the AHSA website.
- Attached is the futurity point sliding scale from which points will be determined: (see information attached)
- There will be separate divisions for slick shorn and fitted ewe lambs. There will also be separate divisions for bred and owned slick shorn and fitted ewe lambs. An individual sheep can only participate in one division.
- Back in 2022 is a yearling ewe futurity program. There will be a fitted and slick shorn division in 2022. Until we see how successful the program is, the purchased and bred and owned ewes will compete in their respective slick shorn and fitted category.

#### **Premiums for Purchased Division and Yearling Ewe Division:**

A minimum of (\$2,000) will be awarded in premium in both the fitted and slick shorn divisions. The guaranteed money totals will be given as follows:

1 <sup>st</sup> - \$400 (20%)	6 <sup>th</sup> - \$175 (8.75%)
2 <sup>nd</sup> - \$300 (15%)	7 <sup>th</sup> - \$150 (7.5%)
3 <sup>rd</sup> - \$250 (12.5%)	8 <sup>th</sup> - \$15 (6.25%)
4 <sup>th</sup> - \$225 (11.25%)	9 <sup>th</sup> - \$100 (5%)
5 <sup>th</sup> - \$200 (10%)	10 <sup>th</sup> - \$75 (3.75%)

#### **Premiums for Bred & Owned Division:**

1 <sup>st</sup> - \$300 (30%)
2 <sup>nd</sup> - \$250 (25%)
3 <sup>rd</sup> - \$200 (20%)
4 <sup>th</sup> - \$150 (15%)
5 <sup>th</sup> - \$100 (10%)

In case of a tie, each animal that is part of the tie will receive the same amount.

## Exhibitor Rules:

- Rules of exhibition shall be those published in respective premium books of each show. Ownership deadlines might vary from state to state. All ewe lambs and yearling ewes must be nominated by Sept 1<sup>st</sup>.
- All juniors who meet the requirements for the Junior Show at the North American Livestock Exhibition are eligible to participate in the Futurity Ewe Lamb and Yearling Ewe program. Rules for the NAILE are:
  - Not to be more than 21 years of age the date of the show in November, no lower age limit but junior member must be physically capable of showing his/her own ship.
  - Junior member must be present to show their own sheep unless physically impaired. If the junior member is physically impaired, the junior member must still be present at the show that the futurity ewe lamb or yearling ewe is being shown at and earning points from even if they are unable to show their own lamb in the show ring.
  - Animals purchased must be transferred through the AHSA office. The date of sale will reflect when the animal was purchased and must be prior to September 1<sup>st</sup>. No ewe lamb or yearling ewe will be able to earn futurity points prior to being sold and transferred to the junior member or registered in the bred and owned division.
  - Current year paid membership in the American Hampshire Sheep Association is required. Membership must be paid prior to September 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Juniors are responsible to be knowledgeable of and abide by these rules.
- All ewe lambs and yearling ewes must be purchased and transferred directly to the youth and must be recorded in the AHSA office by the sale management or with a completed 2022 AHSA Futurity Nomination form. For the bred and owned division, the ewe lamb and yearling ewes must be bred by the immediate family or by the junior member. Immediate family is defined as grandparents, parents and siblings of the junior exhibitor. These ewe lambs and yearling ewes can remain in multiple juniors' names but only one junior can submit point forms on each individual animal. If the lamb is transferred out of the youth's name it will NO LONGER be eligible. No partnerships, farm, family, 4-H club or FFA chapter names will be accepted. Also, the purchaser cannot be a family member or family member of an employee of the breeder of the lamb.
- Ownership of ewe lambs and yearling ewes or points earned in the futurity are not transferrable to any other person other than the original owner, nor are the points transferable from one animal to another.
- No futurity entrant may receive premiums for more than two ewe lambs. Total points earned by two animals cannot be combined to one animal.

## Consignor Rules:

- Entries are limited to yearling ewes and fall and spring born ewe lambs.
- Nomination fee is \$25 per ewe lamb or yearling ewe and payable to the AHSA. Fee will be paid to the AHSA office by the breeder of the animal or the junior member who nominated their own animal and must be submitted at the time of the transfer or registration of the lamb. **Breeder nomination fee of the entire 2022 lamb crop can be done by paying a one-time \$200 nomination fee.**
- Each yearling ewe or ewe lamb must conform and abide by the rules and regulations of the individual sale (see below)
  - Yearling Ewes or ewe lambs sold in an online or production or by private treaty can be nominated for the 2022 AHSA futurity program by completing and submitting the 2022

AHSA futurity nomination form along with the nomination fee. Transfers must be completed within three weeks of the sale date.

-Yearling ewes and ewe lambs nominated at public auction managed by Heartland Group, Banner Sale Mgt, or any other recognized sale management, will be recorded by the sale management at the time of the show and designated with an F brand prior to the sale.

- Junior members may re-nominate yearling ewes that were futurity nominated in 2020 by submitting the AHSA futurity nomination form and paying the \$25 nomination fee.

- The AHSA will not be held responsible for any dispute and or disagreements between buyers and sellers.
- Animals will be permanently identified for futurity purposes and recorded by their individual scrapie tag number and/or flock tag number.

## ALB Releases Annual Report

"It's been three years since our rebranding, and the American Lamb Checkoff lit a fire with consumers this past year," said 2021 American Lamb Board Past Chair Gwendolyn Kitzan in the board's just released Fiscal Year 2021 Annual Report. "What could have been months of downturn for our industry has sparked some of the best sales increases we've seen."

The 2021 American Lamb Board Annual Report is available at [LambResourceCenter.com](http://LambResourceCenter.com).

In 2021 - as in 2020 - ALB responded to the changes brought about in the American sheep industry by the COVID-19 pandemic and other situations with strategic action, seizing new opportunities to expand lamb's place in the U.S. diet and economy. In Fiscal Year 2021 - Oct. 1, 2020 to Sept. 30, 2021 - ALB had a total budget of \$1.6 million, allocated as follows: \$995,040 for promotion, \$236,365 for communications, \$106,098 for research, \$132,640 for U.S. Department of Agriculture oversight and \$132,009 for administration.

Promotions continued to be a primary part of ALB's work during the past year. As confined consumers turned to their outside grills, so did ALB. Its Food Blogger Network was expanded to include outdoor cooking experts for a total of 24 paid partnerships with a social media reach of 6.9 million, who contributed 34 new American lamb recipes with photos and videos. Total media reach hit 20 billion impressions and 4,400 lamb articles. Consumer media gave considerable coverage to the ALB Outdoor Cooking Poll, which kicked off a series of seasonal social media promotions. ALB's new take on Lamb Lover's Month and holiday cooking rounded out seasonal promotions.

Virtual events also hit the spot to take the place of traditional face-to-face activities. Outdoor cooking workshops, an American Culinary Federation butchery demo and Homemade Consumer Cooking Classes were immensely popular. Taziki's Mediterranean Café add a heavily promoted American Lamb Burger to its menu, and Lebanese Taverna rolled out a holiday takeout pack at its Washington, D.C.-area restaurants.

In 2021, ALB partnered with Premier 1 Supplies to sponsor a video series on lamb quality for sheep producers. Produced by the North Dakota State University Extension Service, the series is available at [LambResourceCenter.com](http://LambResourceCenter.com). ALB also provided promotional tools to help the industry reach consumers with American lamb's message and assisted local lamb groups in reaching out through its Lamb Promotional Partnership Program. And ALB made plans to sponsor the American Lamb Summit, scheduled for Aug. 8-11.

Providing the latest information requires an investment in research. ALB is in the midst of a multi-phase flavor profiling project with Texas Tech and Colorado State universities. Phase III found Rapid Evaporative Ionization Mass Spectrometry is accurate in predicting flavor attributes that correlate with consumer sensory panel testing. The knowledge will enable classifying lamb into flavor profiles to market lamb more successfully to consumers with differing preferences.

Meanwhile, a new multi-year study at Michigan State University is identifying lamb's environmental footprint to provide accurate data and opportunities for industry improvements.

# YOUTH CONNECTION

The compelling argument, of should there be breed classes in market shows or just divide classes by weights?

All over the US you can find both, breed classes (that are then sorted by weight) as well as many that just weight them up with no concern for breed character. I think you will find this happens in many other species like cattle and hogs. So which way is right or should there be a change? I must admit it is easier for the committee or superintendent to weigh them for class breaks. No need to have a classifier or to check registration papers. But is easier always better?

Many of your breed associations were started over 100 years ago. They support hundreds of shows and awards for juniors each year. The shows that have breed classes quite often give trophies such as belt buckles that become treasured memories for years to come.

I believe sorting market animals by breed gives more advantages to showmen and producers alike. For the showmen you can choose to compete with a variety of different breeds or concentrate on one in particular. The Hampshire breed has been very dominant in shows for many years now. The big boned stout look with the ever impressive wooly legs is hard to beat. It has been so popular recently that many believe, they should just be weighed up. Because so many of the other breeds have dropped in number at many shows.

The current judging style is to blame for the over powering Hampshire influence on today's shows. They have somehow decided there is one perfect design they think a market lamb should be. I'm not quite sure this is good for the sheep industry as a whole. Growing up in Iowa. We enjoyed the dairy show at the Iowa State Fair. I remember the judges comment while sorting the supreme drive which usually consisted of all the major breeds. He stated that a supreme cow should be the animal that excels its breed the most. This type of thought can be used while sorting market lambs as well. For example if the Dorper hair champion far excels his breed then shouldn't he be consider for the Grand not just the cookie cutter style that others have used in the past. This is food for thought.

Breed classes not only give the showmen more choices, but as a producer being able to concentrate on improving his own breed is more profitable and rewarding. The old idea that the crossbred animal should be the best because it combines the best of all breeds. Truthfully sometimes it works and sometimes it doesn't. The fact is no crossbreds can even exist without the purebreds first.

I believe a better job can be done by associations to set breed standards for a classifier is to follow at market shows. Or better yet a requirement that all breeds must be registered with papers in hand to compete in these breed classes and the association make the fee reasonable for producers. If we work harder to make sure our breed is represented the way the association wants it to be we will all be better off.

# SELECTION IN YOUR FLOCK

If our breed shows are represented by true purebreds and not crossbred look alike's then we can start to gain back the integrity that has been lost along the way.

There can be disadvantages in Breed Shows; if you choose to show a breed with small numbers it can be hard to hit a class that doesn't have small weight breaks or in most cases just one class for the entire breed. When this happens quite often the heavier sheep has the advantage. Also a disadvantage, is it's up to the classifier what breed you have and many times there is a difference of opinions.

Depending what state you live in there are weigh or breed shows at all levels of competition. National shows like American Royal basically weigh them up while NAILE are by breeds. Whether you are just starting out or a seasoned pro you should know the shows you plan on attending and how they normally break the classes ahead of time. When preparing to exhibit at weight only shows things to remember are: What and how the classes were broke over the past few years? For instance at weight shows for sheep under 130 pounds the weight breaks are normally bigger per class. At the larger shows some classes may have only a half-pound difference in weight range. When preparing for weight classes first and foremost your lamb needs to look appropriate for his weight. If he normally has a belly adjust the feed intake beforehand. The use of electrolytes, drenches, feed amounts, water intake and acute observation of how he is reacting and looks prior to the show class are very important. There is no set program that works for each sheep or animal for that matter. The biggest mistake most make are trying to fit there lamb to a certain weight. I suggest you decide what weight you believe he will look his best at and then feed and prepare him to hit that target.

When you like a certain breed like Hampshire. Your first choice is breed character to make sure he will classify to that breed. So many lambs change after the baby fuzz and first shearing takes place. So study the family tree to get the desired look as they get older. Many lambs look black and or natural appearing pre weaning but grow out of it as they age. Most commercial show feeds are geared for the blackface cross lambs. So if you choose Southdown, Dorset, and or Hair sheep know the growth pattern and fleshing ability of the breed you choose, to optimize your feeding program.

Just a few things to consider as you put together a show string this year.

He also served the Chautauqua Sheep and Wool Growers Association as Director and past President, a Director of the Penn State Meat Evaluation Center, a Warren County 4-H leader, a livestock judge for many fairs in the region, a sheep judge for the Keystone International Livestock Exposition, and the North American Livestock Exposition. John was also a Director of the Warren County Fair Board, the Warren County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee as chairman and Director, he served as the Scandia School Board President, was Chairman and trustee of the Scandia Covenant Church, later a trustee for the Russell United Methodist Church, and most recently attended the Cable Hollow Church where he was involved in the Wednesday bible study. # ***Sheep Industry Report Provides 2021 Assessment***

The sheep and lamb industry saw prices reach historic levels in 2021. The year of outstanding domestic demand for lamb is summarized in the 2021 Sheep Industry Review, a checkoff funded report commissioned by the American Lamb Board (ALB) and compiled by the American Sheep Industry Association.

"The pandemic continued to bring uncertainty during 2021, which drove shifts in consumer food consumption and buying patterns," says ALB Chairman Peter Camino of Buffalo, Wyoming. "Per capita lamb consumption was 1.36 pounds per person for 2021, the highest level since the early 1990's. Gains in lamb consumption have been linked to the year-round availability of more lamb cuts in supermarkets and direct sales as a result of the pandemic."

Various factors on the supply side supported higher lamb prices. Persistent drought, higher feed costs and other production constraints, as well as strong slaughter ewe prices, resulted in significantly large mature sheep slaughter in 2021. The continuing downward trend in the U.S. sheep flock has resulted in a smaller lamb crop and lamb supply. Additionally, cold storage inventories in 2021 were below year ago levels which provided further support to lamb prices.

Although economic uncertainty continued in 2021, with focus on price inflation and consumer response to higher prices for meat and other goods, the feeder and slaughter lamb prices saw gains of more than 40% in 2021. The wholesale lamb market also saw record highs in response to strong consumer demand and tighter available supplies.

## ***Inventory***

Sheep & lamb inventory continued a declining trend, down 2% to 5.065 million head. Breeding sheep inventory registered at 3.71 million head, also down 2% from the previous year. Replacement prices posted large gains during the latter half of 2021, similar to live lamb and wholesale lamb price trends. Ewe prices all set new record levels in 2021.

Texas held onto the top position with 430,000 ewes. California and New Mexico each had the largest ewe increases, both at 8% but with significant difference in total ewes: California's inventory is five times the amount of New Mexico's ewe inventory.

## ***Slaughter and production***

Commercial slaughter was up slightly in 2021 to 2.25 million head. Tighter supplies of feeder lambs were evidenced in lower on-feed numbers during spring and summer months with inventories climbing into the fall. Compared to the 2015–2019 average, on-feed supplies averaged 7% lower.

As the sheep flock has continued to decline, so has lamb production. Commercial lamb production was down only 0.5% for the year but was 8% lower than the 2015–2019 average. This lower production is attributed to smaller lamb supply and lighter weights.

Feeder lamb (60–90 lbs.) prices in 2021 were above previous year levels every week except the first week of March. In fact, the industry saw a new record high posted at \$271.27 per cwt. This equates to 2021 prices that were 45% higher than the 2015–2019 average price. These stronger prices were due to tighter lamb supplies, strong consumer demand for lamb, and growth in ethnic, local and niche market demand.

Slaughter lamb prices also set records coming in 44.8% higher than 2020, averaging \$217.25 per cwt. The record high was set in early August. This brings 2021 prices 46% higher than the 2015–2019 average.

Wholesale lamb values reached record levels during the second half of 2021. The robust wholesale market was supported by strong consumer demand, supply constraints in the meat and poultry complex and year-round availability of more lamb cuts in supermarkets. Based on retail data collected by 210 Analytics, LLC, across fresh and processed meat, lamb was the only one to grow pound sales year-on-year in 2020. Lamb also had the highest growth in pound sales when compared to the 2019 pre-pandemic normal.

## ***Imports and exports***

Strong US lamb prices and tight domestic supplies provided an attractive market for lamb imports. In fact, lamb imports were 264.2 million pounds in 2021, up 23.7%.

Mutton imports have surged in the last few years and were up 13.5% to 99.8 million pounds in 2021. Australia was the lead country for lamb imports, contributing 195.6 million pounds at an increase of 20.7% in 2021. New Zealand also contributed to lamb import totals at 32.9% above 2020 and 64.4 million pounds. Overall, imports responded to record high U.S. wholesale lamb prices during the latter half of 2021.

Exports for lamb and mutton totaled 3.48 million pounds, 7.6% higher than in 2021. Growth in the export sector was driven primarily by lamb variety meat exports to Mexico. Lamb muscle cut exports rallied to the Caribbean in 2021, with notable growth in the Dominican Republic and gains to Bermuda, the Bahamas, Trinidad and Tobago and Turks and Caicos. Lamb exports as a percent of lamb and mutton production were 2.4%, slightly higher than in 2020, but lower than the 2015–2019 average of 3.7%.

Live sheep exports increased in 2021 driven by exports to Canada, which accounted for 74% of all live sheep exports. Live exports to Mexico have been on a decline in recent years.

## ***Market outlook***

Looking at 2022, the 2021 Sheep Industry Review report estimates commercial production to decline 4% and commercial slaughter of American Lamb to decrease by about 3%. Likewise, imports are expected to fall 3% to 352 million pounds. Total lamb availability is expected to contract by 5%, with a decline in per capita availability due to the decline in production relative to the US population. In 2022, feeder lamb prices are expected to average 10% higher and slaughter lamb prices to average 5% higher.

Production costs for all segments of the industry are expected to remain high in 2022, making getting lamb to the consumer more costly than prior years. Feed costs are expected to remain high due to drought conditions and strained hay stocks. Tighter lamb supply suggests high live lamb and meat prices will continue in 2022. Inflationary pressure and lower disposable incomes are expected to impact consumer demand and purchasing behavior in 2022. Supply chain constraints and labor challenges are likely to continue during 2022.

## INGREDIENTS

### LAMB

1.5 pound Boneless leg of American Lamb sliced into 1/8 inch thickness, ¼ cup soy sauce

### VEGGIES

2 red onion (thinly sliced), 2 cups bell peppers (different colors thinly sliced), 2 jalapeno peppers (optional, sliced)

### FAJITA MARINADE

½ cup oil (olive or avocado oil), 4 cloves of garlic (minced), ¼ cup lime juice, 2 teaspoon oregano powder, 1 teaspoon garlic powder, 1 teaspoon onion powder, 2 teaspoons chili powder, 1 teaspoon dried parsley, ½ teaspoon cumin, ¼ teaspoon chili flakes (optional to taste), ¼ cup cilantro (minced), 1 ½ teaspoon salt and pepper to taste

### SERVING

8-10 tortillas (flour or corn tortillas - slightly charred), 1 cup shredded Monterey jack or cheddar cheese, salsa or pico de galo, guacamole, shredded lettuce, fresh tomatoes, sliced avocados, sliced green onions, sour cream, lime wedges, fresh cilantro

## DIRECTIONS

Preheat the broiler.

Make the fajita marinade by combining all ingredients in a large bowl.

Take 3 tablespoons of the marinade and place it in a smaller bowl. Add the veggies to the small bowl and toss well with the marinade.

To the large bowl with the remaining marinade, add in ¼ up of soy sauce and the sliced lamb.

Marinate the lamb and veggies anywhere between 10 minutes to 6 hours.

Take a baking sheet and arrange the lamb in a single layer. Broil on high for 8-12 minutes until charred and cooked through. Remove from the oven and set aside for 10 minutes.

Switch the oven to Bake at 400 degrees F. Using the same baking sheet, spread the veggies over the sheet and roast for 15 minutes.

In the meantime, slice up your lamb into smaller fajita size pieces. Throw them back on the baking sheet with the veggies once they're ready. Broil both the lamb and veggies on high for 3 minutes until charred.

Serve the lamb fajitas with the veggies on the same sheet with the different toppings around it and enjoy!

**Note: USDA recommends lamb be cooked to an internal temperature of 145F with a 3 minute rest.**
